PRESIDENTS UPDATE

Hello and welcome to 2026!

The 2025 ski season was a success, characterised by excellent snow, high engagement, and a renewed sense of energy across the higher-altitude alpine areas.

This is especially noted at Perisher with the launch of its new \$26 million Mt Perisher 6 chairlift during the season. Resort milestone for Hotham this year with the recording of its deepest July snowpack (123 cm) and finished with 398 cm of cumulative snow fall – the best in at least 20 years for some statistics. No sooner has winter ended than we find ourselves facing the height of summer and the devastating fires in Victoria. The Board will continue to closely monitor and assess the situation, as the areas surrounding Mt Hotham remain at risk.

At the close of the 2025 season, we decided to shut down the Hotham lodge and completely transform its kitchen in time for the 2025 Christmas and New Year holiday period.

Thanks to the unwavering commitment of our board of directors—especially Sally Garner, Robert Philip and Keith Farrell, this ambitious goal became a reality.

Driving this success was the extraordinary effort of Sally's husband, Mark Tilley, who worked hand-in-hand with the demolition team and builder, ensuring every detail was executed flawlessly. The result? A stunning, fully functional kitchen that stands as a testament to teamwork, vision, and relentless dedication. Thank you!

At the end of the 2025 season, new air-conditioning units were installed in the Jindabyne lodge. We have also installed defibrillators in both the Jindabyne and Hotham lodges to enhance the safety of our members and guests. Additional updates for 2026 include—Clubman has undergone a makeover, enhancing its usability with a fresh look and feel, while the booking engine and database remain the same. No changes or specific actions are required from you. Next time you make a booking or check details of any bookings, your membership details or invoices, you will be using the new interface. Details are shown later in the newsletter.

We are pleased to report that the most recent ski season generated the highest income on record, with this remarkably strong season has led to the highest occupancy rates seen in recent years.

Nevertheless, because of effective planning, the increased income has managed to balance out the high expenses up to now. Our profit is stable in comparison with recent years – a good overall result.

All in all, this is a healthy financial result and allows the Club to reinvest back into the Lodges and/or withstand future poor seasons. Presently, the Club has the financial balance on the right path to ensure ongoing success. This has enabled us to maintain our existing rates throughout the year, without implementing any nightly or weekly accommodation increases.

As the newly appointed treasurer, it is clear that effective planning, budgeting, and continual management of ongoing needs are being undertaken to support the Club's continued success.

The Club's strong financial standing is largely attributable to the dedication and guidance of both current and recently retired long-term Directors, who merit recognition for their contributions.

HOTHAM KITCHEN UPDATE - SALLY GARNER



BOOKING REMINDERS


Please review the [booking rules](#) prior to commencing any bookings for Winter 2026. The rules are available on the website under Documents.

Please Note: when making your first booking in the new year, ensure you have your dates correct.

Where a winter booking is made by a member between February 1st and March 15th, that booking **cannot** be transferred to another party by that member. The booking must be cancelled and only 80% of the fee paid will be returned where the booking has been cancelled with 4 weeks' notice.

Clubman: Please note the update to the look and feel of our booking system.

Navigating the website is straightforward (screen shots below). On larger screens, the menu options appear as dropdowns from boxes located at the top of each page. For smaller mobile screens, the menu can be found under the "hamburger" icon (three small lines) at the top right corner.

- If you are the last out of the Lodge, ensure all internal bins are emptied and all windows and doors are locked. Also check all heaters are off.
